President Signs Bill Expanding Conservation Tax Incentives

On August 17, 2006, President Bush signed the 2006 Pension Reform Bill, legislation that included a provision that provides wonderful new incentives to protect land.

The provision, which expires at the end of 2007, will:

- increase the charitable deduction limit from 30% to 50% of adjusted gross income (AGI) for donations or bargain sales of qualified conservation contributions;
- increase the charitable deduction limit to 100% of AGI for eligible farmers and ranchers (i.e., those who receive more than 50% of their income from farming or ranching), so long as the contribution does not prevent future agricultural use; and
- allow the taxpayer to carry forward the deduction for 15 years (rather than five years).

These new rules apply to gifts of real property interests (typically, a conservation easement) to public agencies or nonprofit conservation organizations exclusively for conservation purposes. As before, conservation purposes include the conservation of land areas for outdoor recreation and education, scenic protection, habitat and ecosystem protection, preservation of historically important lands and/or certified historic structures, and other public benefits.

The new provisions will apply to donations made during calendar years 2006 and 2007. These changes provide added incentive for landowners to donate or make bargain sales of conservation easements to land trusts and conservation organizations.

As always, every conservation easement must clearly identify the purposes of the easement and the resources to be protected. Any reserved rights must be consistent with the protection of the conservation values of the property. The donee land trust, the Steep Rock

Association for example, must have the commitment and the resources to enforce the terms of the restriction.

Trustees Elected

Mark Averill, Natalie Dyer, John Potter and Steve Solley were reelected to the Board after one year off. Steep Rock's by-laws state that Trustees may serve two consecutive three year terms but then must go off the Board for one year. During their year off the Board, they were all active volunteers: John and Steve were members of the Preservation and Forestry Committees; Mark helped on the Stewardship Committee and he's invaluable at the Picnic; and Natalie stayed on the Trails Committee, overseeing all the volunteer trail monitors and organizing volunteer workdays.

Lars Andersson, Bill Coleman and Peary Stafford are the new Trustees elected to the Board.

Lars Andersson, an investment banker at JP Morgan, lives at Gunn Hill Farm, New Preston and New York City with his wife and three children. Lars is a strong believer in protecting open space, agricultural lands, forests and the rural character of our area.

Bill Coleman writes: "We have been in town since March 1988 and have enjoyed it ever since. When my kids were younger they hiked all through Steep Rock, when they were not swimming on the Shepaug summer swim team. I am a retired attorney in Brooklyn New York and Steep Rock has been one of my refuges from the

hectic professional life".

Since arriving in the area 20 years ago, **Peary Stafford** has particularly enjoyed the natural elements of the Steep Rock reservations, especially its birds and insects. Salamanders in Love

or

Try this the next time you're enjoying your dinner or a glass of wine on a rainy April night: put on a pair of boots, grab your rain gear and a strong flashlight, and head off for the hemlock forests of Steep Rock. Once there, get out in the rain and stare into a pond for an hour or so. If the time is right and you're discreet with the light, you might just get a glimpse into the intimate world of salamanders in love.



The smell of homemade Chicken Cacciatore was wafting through the house and I was considering the Heineken chilling in refrigerator when the phone rang. I knew it would be Betsy Corrigan (a fellow Steep Rock Trustee) and almost dreaded the call. "You wanna go?" came the question across the line, and I knew I had to say yes. She and I had been exploring the vernal pools of Steep Rock over the past few weeks and that afternoon we'd talked about hoping the rain would continue into the night. As it had done just that I knew I had no excuse for copping out so I said "Sure!" with an enthusiasm not entirely heart-felt. My wife, BK, shrugged acquiescence and turned off the stove; we pulled on our rain jackets and stepped out into the rainy night. The aroma of that chicken dogged me all the way to Steep Rock.

As I dodged various migrating amphibians on our way into the preserve any patrolling policeman would surely have thought me more than one sheet to the wind. Fortunately, no police lights appeared; rather it was the lights of John & Betsy's car that rose in the mirror as they came down the dirt road behind us. When Betsy and I had inspected the pool near the railroad bed the day before, we found Wood Frog eggs and what looked like Jefferson Salamander eggs, but

none of the eggs of the far more common Spotted Salamander and we were trying to figure out why. Maybe the conditions hadn't been just right and the Spotteds hadn't yet bred? Was the dry weather of this spring deferring the normal timetable? We weren't sure but perhaps this evening's rain would bring all the right elements together and tonight would be the night.

Spotted Salamanders (Ambystoma maculatum) are one of the species in a group of amphibians called Mole Salamanders; so named because they spend the vast majority of their adult lives underground, eating worms, larva, centipedes, arthropods and other delicacies. About the only time they emerge from the burrows that they borrow from small rodents or from under the fallen logs that they favor in the upland woods is when the first warm rains of March or April arrive and soak through the earth. It's then that they bestir themselves and move back to the vernal pool they were born in: sometimes forming mass migrations of hundreds of animals. They've only one thing on their mind at this point – the reproduction of their species – and that's what we were hoping we'd be privy to

I know it all seems a bit voyeuristic but Betsy has been studying vernal pools for a long time without seeing this ritual and I, a recent arrival to the vernal pool set, had certainly never seen it. Hell, I'd never even seen a Spotted Salamander! Besides, it's not as if the salamanders would care!

There was no give in the rain during the short walk from the cars to the pool, and my mind drifted back to the goodies waiting for me back home. When we got to the pool it looked like I might be back there enjoying them sooner than I had thought. The strong beams of our lamps revealed a few caddisfly larvae and diving beetles but nary a salamander. Even with the rain plinking the surface of the water, it was remarkably clear, allowing us to see every detail of the leaf litter

bottom.

But we hadn't come out into this unpleasant night to see leaf litter and I was seriously considering decamping when quietly, John said, "There's one" and we

followed the beam of his light to the bottom of the pool. There in all his glory, lying on the masses of leaves, was a male Spotted Salamander. Almost eight inches long, he was a slender black beast made up of a stack of segments like tiny doughnuts; almost like a stretched-out amphibian Michelin man. Shiny brilliant yellow spots adorned each segment the entire length of his body as well as his legs, head and tail. The contrast of the yellow spots with

Salamanders, cont.

As our lights played across the bottom of the pool we discovered another salamander partially hidden beneath a decomposing oak leaf, then another over to the right and so on and so on until it became apparent that there were probably about 15 salamanders just in the small part of the pool that we could observe. Their beautifully patterned bodies stood in stark contrast with the drab leaves on the bottom of the pool.

These salamanders, unlike frogs, fertilize their eggs internally, but they don't pass the sperm from the male to the female via copulation; no, it's far cooler than that. The male, who arrives in the pool first, awaits his intended in the near-freezing water. When she arrives he deposits a white glutinous droplet capped with sperm (a spermataphore) on the vegetation at the bottom of the pool. If she is sufficiently enticed, the female then lowers herself on the spermataphore, takes it into her cloaca, and the deed is done. I know, I know, but it seems to work for them.

We'd been standing there for almost an hour watching these guys and the other biota of the pool when it became apparent that the salamanders were beginning to form up into little groups; two here, three there, as many as six about ten feet away. Above I mentioned the loaded words "sufficiently enticed" regarding the receptivity of the female. This enticement process is seriously bizarre (but welldocumented by other salamander voyeurs) and it rapidly became apparent that it was underway in our Salamander foreplay was abounding; one would put a snout under the other's leg and roll it over or one would climb over the top of another and slide down the other side or start at the back and swim to the head then back to the tail. Every sort of contact you could imagine was taking place in that pool. In fact, it was difficult to tell just how many salamanders were now involved in the group that had held six just a moment ago. They had become a whorl of squirming black and yellow salamander skin. To make things even more confused (and amusing), as these are air breathing critters, every so often one of them would break off from the frenzy and pop up to the surface for a gulp of air, returning immediately to the writhing mass below.

Soon we noticed that one of the pairs had separated and the male had moved off to the side. As we watched, his tail formed a hump near the base and he began to move it slowly side-to-side. After about twenty seconds of this he quit, swam a short distance away and there it was – a tiny white pellet

on the leaf below. We stood transfixed, as the female sauntered over to the spot and with little fanfare settled on the spermataphore. She in turn moved slowly side-to-side and when she left about a minute later the white spot was still there but the smile on her face told us the sperm cap was inside her. We had witnessed a remarkably cool event, something few people have ever seen, but an incredibly important cog in the most important process of any organism; reproduction of its species.

Raising my gaze from the pool I realized that my drenched baseball cap was draining in a thin rivulet down my back and that in fact, I was rather miserable. Betsy admitted to being in a similar condition and we all agreed to leave the lovers in peace. We walked back to the cars, Betsy picking up and examining various toads on the road, and all of us chattering about the astounding ways that nature adapts to conditions, finding ways to accomplish its needs over all kinds of obstacles. We said goodnight and headed home.
