Volunteer Spotlight

This month, we celebrate <u>all</u> our volunteers for their amazing contributions to Steep Rock. In 2022, we had **217 volunteers** (a record) log a total of 3,311 hours (another record). Two "super" volunteers logged over 200 hours each! Our dedicated volunteers contributed **1,615 hours** to Judea Garden, growing and distributing organic vegetables to food banks and those in need. Trail managers and work parties logged 1,128 hours to keep our trails open, remove invasive species, monitor our preserves, and build the new Boulders Trail. Volunteer community scientists spent 422 hours monitoring nest boxes, counting pollinators, and catching dragonflies and damselflies. Volunteers spent **100 hours** tabling at our events and spreading the good news about Steep Rock as well as 46 **hours** helping in the office. We also recognize our wonderful team of Trustees and Committee members who spend countless hours contributing their knowledge and experience to ensure our organizational success.
