Vernal Pools: Prized Hotbeds for Spring Wildlife

Vernal pools are woodland depressions that hold water in Spring and then typically dry up through the Summer. Several amphibians are dependent on the temporarily inundated environment for breeding and offspring development. Vernal pools provide habitat for a host of other organisms too. more">>more



Join the Pollinator Revolution

What are these signs in and around Steep Rock's preserves? We are participating in No Mow May (NMM), an international effort to help pollinators prosper. Participation is simple and easy--Don't mow your lawn in the month of May. Not mowing benefits butterflies, bees, birds, and wildflowers, decreases hours of yard work, reduces emissions from mowers and weed whackers, and increases diversity of native species. SRA is documenting plant and pollinator diversity in both NMM and mowed areas and will share updates on social media. Join the effort--would you rather hike in our preserves or mow grass?



It's time! Help us grow into our 15th season and get those warmer weather plants in the ground on planting day. Info and registration more">>more




2023 Community Block Party

Steep Rock Preserve: Tunnel Road Bridge Closed in 2023

The Town of Washington is replacing Tunnel Road Bridge over the Shepaug River. The bridge will be closed until November. There is <u>no</u> parking or access to Steep Rock Preserve coming from River Road or Lower Church Hill Road. The only vehicle access is Spring Hill Road off Route 199/Roxbury Road. Horse trailers are prohibited and SR1 and SR2 campsites are closed for the 2023 season. Large group gatherings are discouraged.
