Johnson Farm Eagle Scout Project Completed

Congratulations to Ty Maluda of Troop 65 for completing his Eagle Scout project and making an impactful contribution to Steep Rock's conservation mission. Ty established a nest box trail to support cavity-nesting birds, particularly eastern bluebirds and tree swallows, at our Johnson Farm Preserve. These boxes supplement natural cavities in trees as nest sites, which are often scarce. The availability of this required resource is a determinant factor on the welfare of their populations. Soundly built and erected in quality open habitat, Ty's boxes offer coveted accommodations for breeding pairs of these beautiful, native birds for years to come. Check them out on your next visit and be sure to return in spring.

Judea Garden Wraps Up 15th Season

This season, the amazing Interns and Volunteers of Judea Garden grew, harvested, and distributed 3,567 pounds of organic vegetables to our neighbors in Washington, Warren, New Milford, and Litchfield. That included 775 pounds of tomatoes, 451 pounds of greens, 299 pounds of squash, 239 pounds of root vegetables, and 90 pounds of garlic! Steep Rock Preserve: Tunnel Road Bridge Closed in 2023

The Town of Washington is replacing Tunnel Road Bridge over the Shepaug River. We anticipate the bridge opening in December. There is **no parking or access to Steep Rock Preserve coming from River Road or Lower Church Hill Road**. The only vehicle access is Spring Hill Road off Route 199/Roxbury Road. **Horse trailers prohibited and SR1, SR2 campsites closed for the 2023 season**.
