Last year, **307 volunteers** (enough to stand front to back and stretch the length of an entire football field) **logged over 3,000 hours** (that's equal to 1.5 full time paid staff) for Steep Rock. Our volunteers constructed and monitored trails, cleared debris, built water bars, removed invasives, planted, weeded and delivered organic produce to food banks, led hikes and programs, stuffed envelopes, tabled at events, cooked and served at the annual picnic, counted pollinators, checked nestboxes, surveyed dragonflies, had a ton of fun, and so much more.
