After the hike, they shared with me a wide range of how they felt—anxiety, fear, panic, gratitude— Yes, one hiker was grateful for the experience, and knowing that bears continue to roam Washington and the Litchfield Hills. Like our hiker, we are grateful to <u>you</u> as well. With your help, Steep Rock Association has protected over 5,400 acres of healthy wildlife habitat in perpetuity. From butterflies to bobcats and turtles to our majestic trees, <u>you</u> helped us make an impact. This summer, we've been constructing new trails, repairing existing ones, and surveying nesting wildlife.
