



3.5-acre brush fire in Steep Rock Preserve: March 2021

Enduring Extremes

First some scary news: In mid-August, extreme storms struck our area dumping anywhere from 2-12" of rain in a short period of time, causing significant flooding and property damage in neighboring towns. In the past two months, however, we've received a mere 1 inch or so of rain. This fall, over 100 fires have been documented across Connecticut and the Governor has declared a state of emergency. With no foreseeable rainfall in sight, we are considered at the Extreme Risk Level for fires and the "normal" fall fire season, which typically lasts from leaf drop (early October) through first snowfall, is being amplified by rapidly changing climatic conditions. The good news? Thanks to your contributions and gifts to Steep Rock, staff have implemented several actions that reduce the potential risks to our preserves, trails, and community while enhancing the climate resiliency of our properties. And we appreciate your care and vigilance in these dangerous drought conditions. Let's hope we get some significant soaking precipitation and seasonal temperatures soon.
